This year, UNITY honored cultural pride and youth creativity with a special t-shirt collaboration celebrating California Native heritage. The project began with a youth logo contest, inviting designs that reflected the richness of local Native cultures. The winning concept came from 15-year-old Reese Mitchell of the Colorado River Indian Tribes, whose artwork helped inspire a final design that pays tribute to Kumeyaay culture and the conference theme.

UNITY partnered with the Local Planning Committee and OXDX Clothing—a renowned Indigenous fashion label founded by Diné artist and UNITY alum Jared Kee Yazzie—to bring the vision to life. For Jared, whose first art vending experience was at a UNITY Conference in San Diego over a decade ago, this collaboration marked a powerful full-circle moment. Through this project, OXDX continues its mission to amplify Indigenous voices and empower the next generation of Native artists.

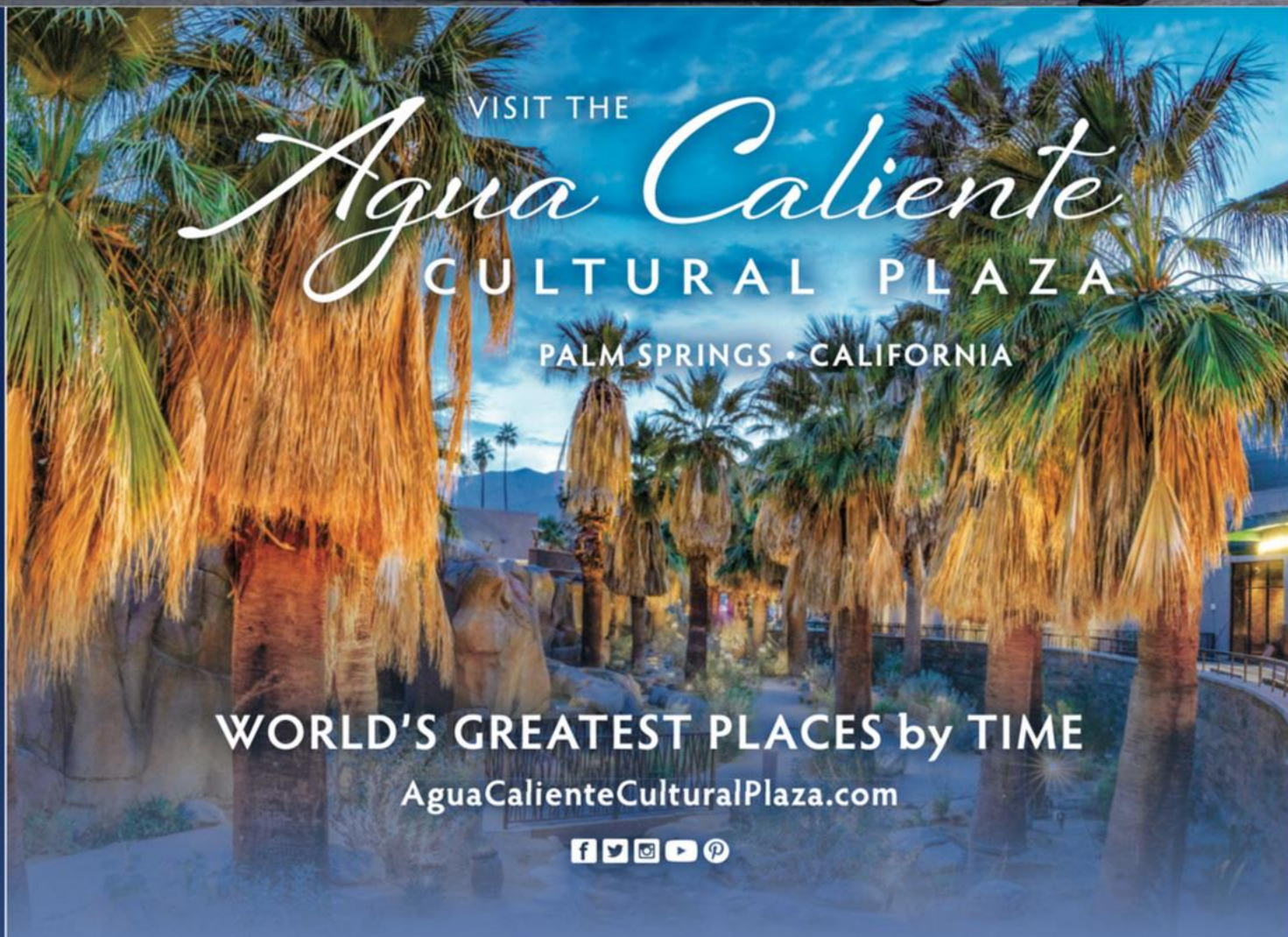

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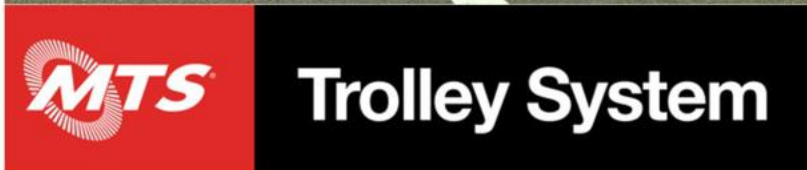
Transportation Information

San Diego

International Airport

Located 7 miles away from Town & Country Resort, receives from than 20 million passengers a year. So few things to cover:

1. READ ID, a requirement for all U.S. residents after May 7th, 2025. You can visit the federal government's website for more information.
2. Transportation to San Diego International Airport
 - a. The San Diego Flyer, an electric shuttle-bus service. Operates 7 days a week between airport and Old Town Transit Center, where you can connect to the Trolley (Trolley Map to the right). Buses stop at both main terminals and arrive every 20-30 minutes.
3. Taxi or Shuttle
 - a. An easy way to get to the main terminals. They can be found at the Transportation Plazas outside each terminal.
4. Car Rentals
 - a. The airport is served by all major car rental companies. There are free shuttles that transport customers between the terminals and Rental Car Center.
5. Bus
 - a. Bus Route 992 (operated by Metropolitan Transit System) takes passengers to and from Downtown's Santa Fe Depot. You may download the PRONTO APP to load funds to pay for your ride.
6. Trolley
 - a. The easiest way to access multiple lines of the San Diego Trolley is by taking the free San Diego Airport Flyer shuttle to Old Town Transit Center.

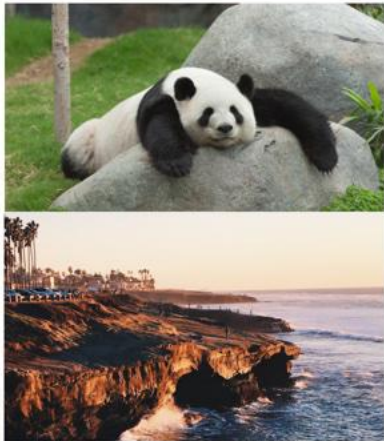
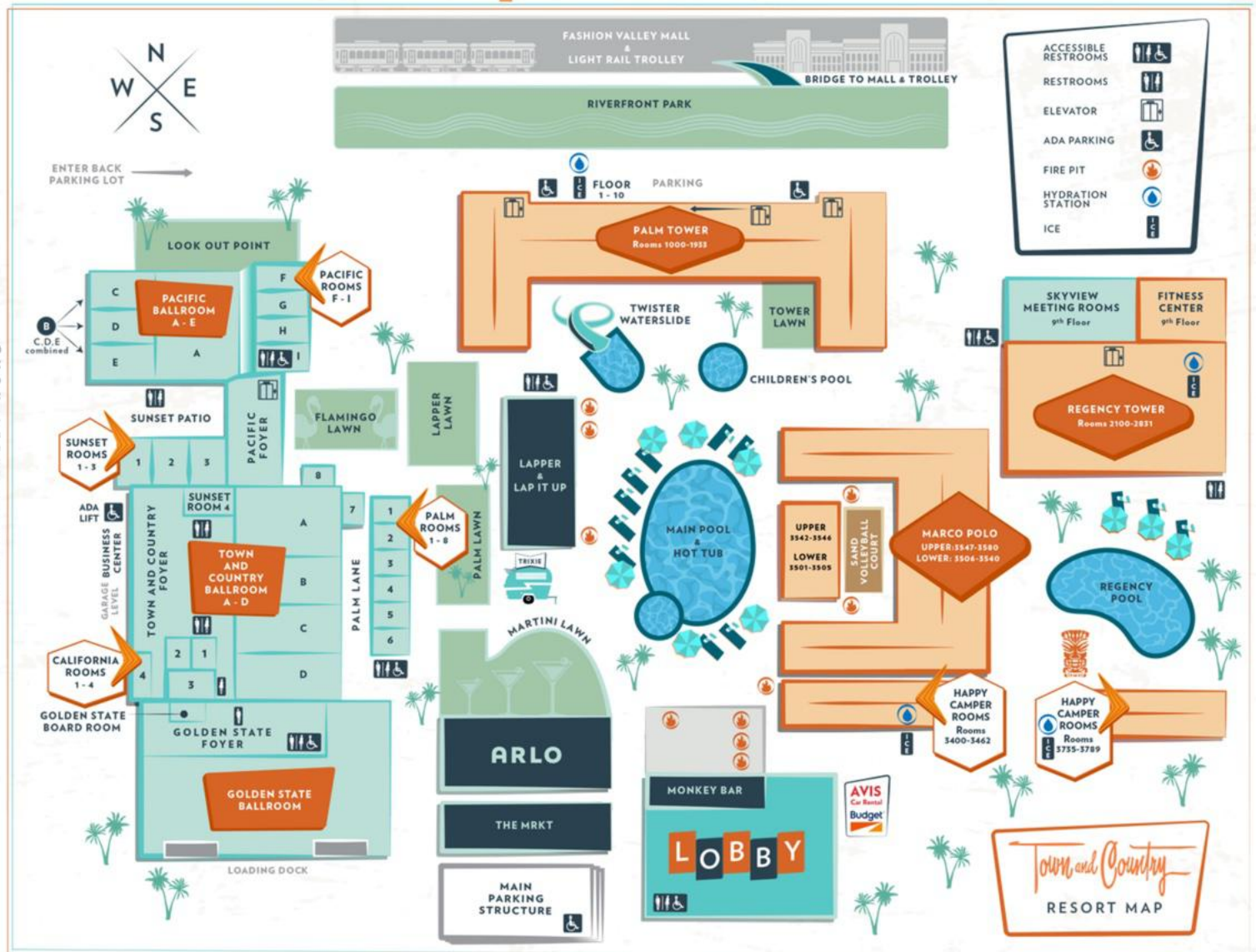

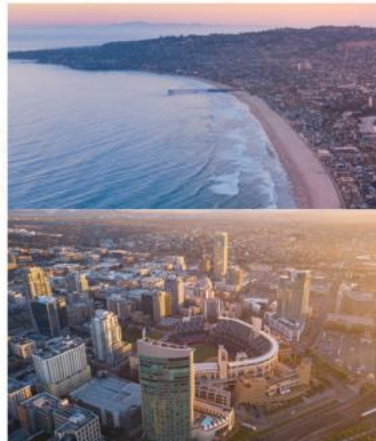


San Diego Zoo

Before you travel, collect all needed documents and store them in a safe place.

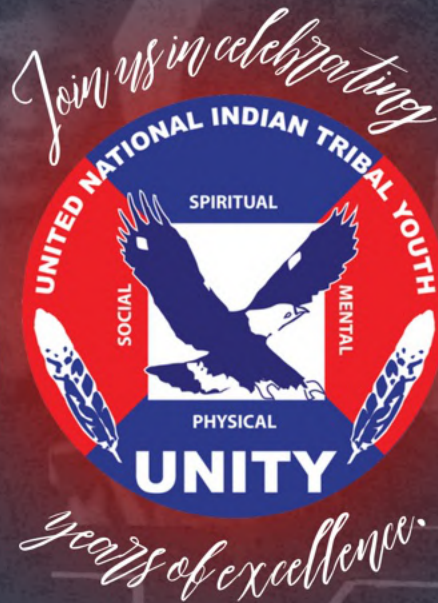
HAVE A PLAN
